

OVERVIEW BY THE MEC FOR FINANCE, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM, MR PS NGOMANE, MPL, DURING DELIBERATIONS WITH THE PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE ON PREMIER'S OFFICE; FINANCE; ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM ON THE FOURTH QUARTER (2018-2019) PERFORMANCE REPORT AND THE ANNUAL PERFORMANCE PLAN OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM AND ITS PUBLIC ENTITIES HELD AT THE MPUMALANGA PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE, CITY OF MBOMBELA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

Chairperson and Members of the Portfolio Committee;

Good morning!

- Thank you very much for affording us an opportunity to appear before you, to come and deliberate on the Fourth Quarter Performance Report of the 2018-2019 financial-year, and the Annual Performance Plan of the Department and its Public Entities, for the 2019-2020 financial-year.
- 2. You will recall that I now wear two (2) hats one as the Executive Authority of the Provincial Treasury, and secondly, as the Executive Authority of the Department of Economic Development and Tourism. For this engagement, were are here to represent the latter.
- 3. I am therefore accompanied by the Accounting Officer and Acting Head of the Department, Mr Nathaniel Sebitso, and his team of senior management, who will after my Overview, provide details relating to the questions you have accordingly raised. Likewise, the CEOs of our three (3) Public Entities will do the same when you interact with them later on.



DEPARTMENT

Chairperson;

- 4. During our last appearance of the Department before this Committee, you were informed that the vacant posts of the Head of Department and the Chief Financial Officer, will be filled soon. In this regard, I can report that interview for the HOD post were held, and we hope the Executive Council will pronounce on it soon.
- 5. In the meantime, the Premier has extended the appointment of Mr Sebitso as the Acting Head of Department for a period not exceeding 6 months or until an appointment is made whichever comes first.
- 6. Regarding the CFO position, the post was widely advertised. The closing date for applications was 19 October 2018, and internal processes are ongoing to finalise the shortlist and interview the prospective candidates. We are confident that we will fill the post soon.
- 7. Chairperson, we remain committed to facilitate economic empowerment opportunities and to promote local economic development in the Province. Against all odds, we continued to provide financial and non-financial support to SMMEs and Co-operatives.
- 8. Amongst others, we have partnered with the Department of Trade and Industry on the Agro-Processing Incentive Scheme which is geared towards stimulating investment opportunities for agri-business enterprises.
- 9. We are currently running workshops Province-wide, to assist small businesses to participate in the Scheme.

PUBLIC ENTITIES:

10. Turning now to our Public Entities;

MEGA (MPUMALANGA ECONOMIC GROWTH AGENCY)

- 11. MEGA is currently facing a leadership crisis. It has no Accounting Authority

 in the form of a Board and is led by an Acting CEO. In the meantime, the legislation allows me to perform the roles and responsibilities of the Board as the MEC and shareholder representative.
- 12. As part of *My First 100 Days in Office* priorities, I have committed to ensure that normalcy is realised within the Entity.
- 13. In this regard, I will within days, appoint an Interim Board whose term of office will not exceed a period of six (6) months as provided for, and prescribed in section 7 sub-section 4 of the MEGA Act, 2010.
- 14. One priority matching order to be given to the Interim Board, is **to resolve the** issue regarding the suspension of the three (3) Executives of *MEGA*, that is, the CEO, CFO and General Manager for Funding.
- 15. I also expect the Interim Board to clarify the matter surrounding **the future of Ekandustria Industrial Park** whether it will remain *MEGA*'s property or it will be transferred to Gauteng. Members will recall that the Industrial Park now legally falls within the boundaries of Gauteng Province, within the Tshwane Metro.
- 16. I must stress that these must be done within My First 100 Days in Office.

- 17. We will, however, not wait for the term of office of the Interim Board to expire; hence we have already called for **Nominations of new Board Members** through newspaper advertisements.
- 18. It is our intention that the New Board for *MEGA* should have been appointed before the expiry of the 6 months mandate period of the Interim Board.

Chairperson;

- 19. It is unfortunate that we have put the **Government Nutrition Programme** on hold, due to some challenges it was facing. We are, however, hard at work to resolve the funding mechanism of the Programme, which was putting serious financial strain on the finances of *MEGA*.
- 20. On the Mpumalanga International Fresh Produce Market, MEGA is currently in talks with IDC to partner with us on the project. We are informed that the IDC Board will decide on the matter soon.
- 21. On the **Nkomazi SEZ**, we are in the process of forming a separate Entity which will run the affairs of the SEZ, as required by the enabling legislation.

MTPA (MPUMALANGA TOURISM AND PARKS AGENCY)

- 22. With regards to the *MTPA*, the Entity continues to **market the Province as a tourist destination of choice**, at local and international tradeshows, albeit not adequately funded. It requires additional funding to effectively carry-out its marketing and promotions functions.
- 23. Nonetheless, we were able launch the Nkangala Resistance and Liberation Heritage Route in March this year. It highlights the key freedom fighters who fought against racial segregation, as well as the destinations that featured prominently during the liberation struggle. The four (4) key towns and sites

forming part of this Heritage Route include **Delmas**, **eMalahleni**, **Botshabelo** and **Mapoch Caves**.

Chairperson;

- 24. One of the priority area requiring immediate funding is for the establishment of the Management Authority for the Barberton Makhonjwa Mountains World Heritage Site. This was one non-negotiable condition of the inscription of the Site by UNESCO.
- 25. We cannot, therefore, fail on this one. We need to find funding somewhere to address this issue. If we do not do that, we run the risk of our Site losing its World Heritage status.
- 26. The MTPA has further continued to exercise its responsibility regarding the management and conservation of biodiversity and ecosystems in the Province, despite financial and human resource constraints.

MER (MPUMALANGA ECONOMIC REGULATOR)

- 27. Turning to MER, the Entity continues to perform as mandated. It continues to collect revenue due to the fiscus on gambling levies and liquor licenses, and has further implemented various responsible gambling and drinking awareness campaigns across the Province. Details on how much was collected during the fourth quarter will be provided by the CEO, later on.
- 28. The Entity, however, is still facing the daunting challenge of coming up with one (1) consolidated database of all liquor license holders in the Province. In a nutshell, we cannot say, with certainty, confirm the number of liquor licenses previously issued, owing to various liquor licensing legislations under which those licenses were issued. The consolidation process is, nonetheless continuing, and will be completed very soon.

29. The other challenge facing *MER* is the **acquisition of a system which will automatically inform liquor license holders about the impending expiry of their licenses**, and even advise them to renew them, in case they still wish to continue trading. We hope this will be resolved in due course.

30. Lastly, the Entity is in the process of **reviewing liquor licenses fees**. This follows a benchmark exercise which made us realise that we still charge very low fees, as compared to other Provinces. We want to adjust them to be in line with the national norm.

31. Having provided an **Overview** of the performance and plans of the Department and its implementing Agents, I will now pause here, to allow the Acting Head of Department and his team to provide the details.

32. I am aware that you have scheduled separate engagements with our Public Entities later on, where the CEO will also provide details. We, the Acting HOD and myself, would be happy to remain and be part of those engagements, if you wish so.

33. Once again, let me express our appreciation for this engagement, as this guides us in doing our work.

34. Let's grow Mpumalanga together!
